TELEVISION PROGRAM TO FEATURE ORO VALLEY HISTORY

April 12, 2006

Oro Valley will be “live—on the air” for local cable television customers and elsewhere throughout the region as a result of the Town’s participation in Access Tucson’s “Government Connection” program that will air on Wednesday, April 26, at 6:30 p.m. on Comcast Channel 74 and Cox Channel 99.

The April 26 broadcast is scheduled to feature Town founder and historian James D. Kriegh and Pam Sarpalius, Chair of the Town’s new Historical Preservation Commission. They will be discussing the history of Oro Valley and steps that are being taken to protect and preserve historical sites, documents and pictures.

The program will be aired live from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. with Kriegh and Sarpalius taking call-in questions. Once the program has been taped, it will be re-broadcast on Sunday, April 30, at 5:30 p.m. and Tuesday, May 2, at 12:00 noon.

Participation in the “Government Connection” series is part of a larger effort on the part of the Town to share information with Oro Valley residents.

Access Tucson was established as an independent, non-profit, membership based organization for the management of public access television in 1984. It receives its funding via the cable companies, private and corporate donations, and is eligible for funding from the City of Tucson. There is no charge to the Town of Oro Valley to participate in the “Government Connection” series.
