

Individual Training Session with College Coaches

We expect these sessions to number approximately 100 participants spread across all 4 fields, so approximately 25 participants per field.

Key points to our plan: All participants will be checked in at their car, where they will complete a Covid questionnaire (see attached) and their temperature will be taken. They will be given a specific staging area where they will place their gear. These areas will be designated on the fields so players can socially distance during breaks and before the camp begins. All staff are required to wear masks and no spectators will be allowed. We will also have a sanitation station set up, where players will be encouraged to use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer after every break. Campers will be responsible for bringing their own equipment to minimize sharing. Finally, we will stagger breaks in an attempt to further distance players. Below are the details that will be emailed to all participants several times prior to the camp.

Check-in: Please follow the traffic pattern displayed in the attached image. Your camper should remain in your car, pull around and camp personnel will ask several questions, take the player's temperature, and direct the player to their field and equipment staging area. Once the camp is over, groups will be dismissed in stages, they may gather their equipment and make their way back to the original check-in area for pickup. Check-in will start at **X:XX am** (time to be determined) and the first group will be released at **X:XX am**. Please drive slowly and be aware when dropping off and picking up campers.

Equipment: Players must bring their own ball, sufficient water or sports drinks, and shin guards. We will provide the player with a clean bib, if needed, and the camper will keep that bib through the duration of the camp. Sharing bibs is not allowed.

Spectators: Due to state regulations we are **NOT** allowed to have anyone other than coaches and authorized personnel on the fields or sidelines. There are areas where spectators can watch either from their cars or dirt walking paths around the park. If you elect to leave your vehicle please wear a mask, keep socially distanced, and do not enter the grassy areas.

Sanitizing Stations: We will review, with each camper, the location of the sanitizing stations and the importance of using those stations each time players leave the field. An alcohol-based hand sanitizer will be available at these stations.

Other information:

- Maximum of 50 campers per field.
- No Sideline Spectators – State restrictions have limited sideline activity to coaches and authorized personnel only. Parents can watch from parking area but no parents or spectators will be allowed on the fields at any time.
- Masks – All coaches and authorized personnel must wear masks at all times.
- Individual Camper's Equipment – Campers must bring their own ball, shin guards, and hydration. We are restricted from providing any shared equipment, including balls, water stations or bottled water at the field.
- Bibs (training vests) – Campers will be assigned a bib at the start of the camp, be responsible for it through the camp, and return it at the end of the camp. No sharing of bibs will be allowed. If an alternate color is required a clean bib will be provided by staff.
- Sanitation Stations – College Soccer Experience will maintain stations with hand sanitizer. Campers will have access to the sanitation station at any time and will be instructed to disinfect prior to all water breaks.

- Staggered Breaks – Each group will break at different intervals to maintain social distancing.
- Personal Belonging – Each camper will be assigned a social distanced staging area for all personal belongings. Campers will be expected to maintain their personal belongings in their individual staging area.
- Registration – No walkup or on field registration will be allowed.
- Check-in – In order to start the camp on time, It is critical that we all follow the check-in procedures.
 - **Day 1:** Camp personnel will meet the camper at their car within the drive up lane, complete the Covid-19 questionnaire with their parent or guardian, finalize any outstanding paperwork (if any), provide camp t-shirt, assign camper a personal belongings station, and provide their coaching group/field assignment. Check-in will begin at **6:30 am**. Sessions will start at **7 am**. Campers will not be allowed to join a session without clearance; therefore, bypassing the check-in line will delay the campers start.
 - **Day 2:** Camp personnel will meet the camper at their car within the drive up lane, complete the Covid-19 questionnaire with their parent or guardian, remind them of their personal belonging station number and coaching group/field assignment. Check-in will begin at 6:30 am. Any camper who bypasses the check-in procedure will not be allowed to participate until the Covid-19 questionnaire have been completed.
- Attached is our Check in Questionnaire – Please review the information listed. A “yes” response to any of the questions will make the camper ineligible to participate. This is a sample document for your review - **Do not complete prior to arrival.**

Covid-19: We want everyone to understand that although we are doing what we can to minimize Covid-19 exposure/transmission at our camps, it is important to remember that an inherent risk of exposure to Covid-19 exists in any public place where groups of people are present for extended periods of time. By attending the camp, you, understand this risk and are willing to voluntarily assume all the risks related to exposure to Covid-19. We further understand that every family is expected to determine their own risk tolerance with respect to Covid-19. We respect these individual decision and are willing to refund any participants who are unwilling to assume this risk at this time. Full refunds will be provided upon request through the 20th of December and credit for future camp will be provided anytime thereafter.
