

ADOT begins work on Oracle Road



The long-awaited work on Oracle Road (State Route 77) has officially begun! This construction project, which is being managed by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), will result in improved road conditions, safety features and ADA compliance in three phases, spanning from the I-10 junction up to Calle Concordia in Oro Valley. By the time you receive this newsletter, work will have likely begun on the section between Magee Road and Calle Concordia. In-person Council meetings to resume September 8

Oro Valley Town Council is officially on recess through the end of August and will resume meetings on Wednesday, September 8, 2021.
