Oro Valley Community & Recreation Center still open!



Did you know that the Oro Valley Community Center is still allowed to operate with certain COVID-19 safety precautions in place? So if you're missing that elliptical machine, barbell or yoga class, then keep reading! For several months, Community Center staff has had a robust mitigation plan in place, per health department requirements, such as reducing capacity to 25%, requiring face coverings while inside the facility, performing rigorous cleaning, disinfecting and sanitation protocols, and checking the temperature and wellness of each person entering the facility. In order to

ensure a 25% capacity, reservations are now required for entry. Please visit www.PlayOV.com to reserve up to two-hour blocks of gym time or fitness classes.

The health and well-being of our facility users and staff remains our top priority, and we will continue to go above and beyond to ensure a safe environment. COVID-19 is a fluid situation, and staff will continue to monitor county and state data and requirements to ensure full compliance. OVSafeSteps awards more than \$250,000 to Oro Valley businesses







Since its launch in September, the OVSafeSteps program has awarded more than \$250,000 in grant reimbursements to Oro Valley businesses to support them during the pandemic. In addition, the Town of Oro Valley recently increased the amount of grant funding to \$4,500 for small businesses that meet the eligibility criteria. This program, in partnership with the Oro Valley Chamber of Commerce, aims to support local business and encourage safety precautions, because a healthy community leads to a healthy economy. Small businesses (fewer than 50 employees) located in Oro Valley may still apply for grant reimbursement to cover things like marketing, PPE and professional services.
