10-year action plan


- Community driven, 10-year policy document guiding long-term decisions for the community.
- Every jurisdictions is required to have a 10-year plan. Topics included in the plan are based on size and growth rate.
- Must be updated or re-adopted every 10 years. Requires:
 - Voter approval (51+%)
 - 2/3 majority vote of Town Council




INTRODUCTION

Comprehensive

- > State required planning elements
- > Addresses topics that determine residents' quality of life
- Something for all interests



Importance

- Leads to real results in the community:
 - Increased accessibility and communication from the Town
 - Best practices for saguaro protection
 - Community Recreation Center improvements
 - Naranja Park improvements
 - Drainage Criteria Manual
 - Water infrastructure expansions
- Must accurately represent residents to stay relevant over a 10year time frame
- Best opportunity to spark action in the community!





Community Engagement Plan

Resident feedback is the #1 priority

- Guiding Principles for Engagement
 - > Be Inclusive and Prioritize Community Input
 - Be Engaging and Effective
 - Be Organized, Efficient and Timely
 - Be Fair and Open
 - Provide Understandable and Accessible Information





Pillars of Engagement

- > Invite all residents to participate.
- ➤ Inform residents with information to help them create the 10-year plan.
- **Engage** <u>residents</u> by providing convenient and accessible ways for them to participate.
- > Collaborate with <u>resident</u> working groups.
- Feedback heard during phase 1 to make decisions that will create the 10-year plan.

 Empower all residents to vote on the plan.



Spectrum of Resident Participation

Phase 1: Let's Talk

The #1 goal is to make sure the plan represents what most residents said

- Extensive engagement conducted between October and July
- Received significant direction from residents about OV's future
- Over 8,900 contributions that will be used by resident working groups to build the plan

Phase 1 Report

ALL resident responses create the foundational building blocks of the plan.

- Bring all responses together to produce themes
 - Statistically valid phone survey used as a guide – projectable to all OV adults
 - Event and online comments provide additional context the survey did not capture
- References the statistically valid housing phone survey and the Parks and Recreation Master Plan
- Report only includes resident responses highly consistent amongst all three tools

Safety, low crime, OVPD





- 1981: The General Plan envisions <u>mostly housing</u>, but some business development is anticipated on the remaining undeveloped land in Oro Valley. While each will be distinctive in its own character, a cohesive blend will be required with existing neighborhoods and uses.
- 1990: Multiple visions Maintain natural community character through constant public attention to environmental values, use compatibility and restraint in the construction of built forms for human activity. Maintain the delicate environmental balance for all living things in Catalina/Tortolita foothills; preserving natural openness of mountains, deserts and washes; preventing further degradation of, and restoring air, water and scenic attributes for future generations' benefits.
- 1996: To be a town that is recognized as a <u>well-planned community</u> that strives to balance the needs of today against the potential impacts to future generations, while recognizing the limitations of its resources.
- 2003/2005: To be a <u>well-planned community</u> that uses its resources to balance the needs of today against the potential impacts to future generations. Oro Valley's lifestyle is defined by the highest standard of <u>environmental integrity, education, infrastructure</u> <u>services, and public safety</u>. It is a community of people working together to create the Town's future with a government that is responsive to residents and ensures the long-term financial stability of the Town.
- 2016: Oro Valley strives to be a <u>well-managed community</u> that provides all residents with opportunities for quality living. Oro Valley will keep its friendly, small-town, neighborly character, while increasing services, <u>employment and recreation</u>. The Town's lifestyle continues to be defined by a strong sense of community, a high regard for <u>public safety</u> and an extraordinary natural <u>environment</u> and scenic views.

Group Vision Statements

The Town of Oro Valley will preserve its stunning natural beauty and exceptionally safe community while welcoming new community, enhancing businesses and services and developing cultural and recreational opportunities that appeal to the residents and visitors of Oro Valley.

Oro Valley residents seek to maintain a <u>safe</u> and <u>friendly community</u> for all. Strive for more <u>amenities</u>, <u>arts and cultural</u> events to enrich the community. Preserve <u>natural beauty, views</u> and <u>recreational</u> <u>opportunities</u> (trails, biking, etc.

Oro Valley strives to preserve its <u>natural beauty</u>, including <u>views</u>. An essential part of OV is the <u>outdoors and recreation</u>. The Town continues to value <u>safety</u> and <u>community</u>.

The people of Oro Valley value a <u>safe</u> community that is known for its <u>views</u>, <u>natural beauty</u> and outstanding <u>outdoor recreational</u> opportunities, encompassing <u>arts</u> <u>and culture</u> while supporting a <u>business-friendly</u> environment, which supports more <u>services and</u> <u>amenities!!!</u>

The Town of Oro Valley provides an environment keeping the <u>safety</u> of its residents at the forefront of the community. Being the stewards to preserve the <u>outdoor natural beauty</u> and <u>environment</u>, providing <u>services and amenities</u> to engage the community to preserve a desired lifestyle.

The Town strives to foster <u>a strong sense of</u> <u>community</u>, prioritize <u>public safety</u>, and values the <u>natural beauty</u> of our surroundings. Oro Valley balances its beautiful <u>outdoor environment</u> and <u>recreation</u> while balancing that with a <u>business-friendly</u> environment and improving and growing its <u>arts and culture</u>.

Draft Vision Statement: A high-level view of the community's values and aspirations for the future

- 55% OV should have more live, work, & play opportunities.
- 85% OV should be known as a low crime community.
- 80% OV should be known for its desert and mountain views.
- 74% OV should be known as an outdoor/rec community.
- 19% Value OV's strong sense of community.

Oro Valley is a community that provides all residents with more services, amenities, and opportunities for high-quality living.

The Town meets the community's expectations through strategic and intentional improvements.

The Town maintains its unique character by prioritizing public safety, natural beauty, scenic views, outdoor living, and a strong sense of community.




Wordsmith Challenge

Level of participation shows overall, the vision statement accurately reflects what residents' value. Refinements needed.

- Resident feedback on the draft vision and 13 guiding principles
- Promoted by:
 - > Postcards to every household
 - ► Roadway signs
 - >E-newsletters, articles, ads, social media
 - >15 events around the community
- > 129 residents took the challenge online

Age groups of those who took the challenge





Wordsmith Challenge

3 out of 5 people who took the challenge felt the vision accurately reflects what most residents value



At events, 81 people determined the vision statement reflects what most residents value





48 suggestions were provided to <u>better capture</u> residents' values.

Wordsmith Challenge

Reorder statements

Make more succinct

Define or use other words instead of "more"

Oro Valley is a community that provides all residents with **more services**, **amenities**, **and opportunities** for high-quality living.

Descriptions for "community"

Revise to be forward focused.

The Town meets the community's expectations through strategic and intentional improvements.

Combine with other sentences.


Prioritize views higher

Add values like art, culture, business-friendly
