JDK Park playground is getting an upgrade!

Oro Valley Parks and Recreation is excited to announce that the playground at James D. Kriegh Park will be replaced with brand-new playground structures, play surface and shade structure. (See rendering on the right.) Before the new amenities can be installed, the existing playground and surface must first be removed. As such, the playground and ramada will be closed for construction mid-February through late March.





New walking path lighting at Riverfront Park

In 2020, as the pandemic drove more people to outdoor recreation, the walking path around Riverfront Park saw an increase in usage. Since this path currently has no lighting, the Town of Oro Valley began utilizing ball field lighting as a short-term measure to keep the entire park lit in the evening for safety and visibility along the path. The Town is happy to announce a more energy-efficient, long-term solution: pedestrian lighting will soon be installed along the entire path! Weather permitting, the installation should be completed in late February, at which point the ball field lights will only be turned on at night when official field reservations are made.
