For the return season, the Town has launched this initial effort as a pilot program while we further refine the program and costs for ongoing operation. This refreshed tour is two hours long and includes more than 20 locations around Oro Valley to see dozens of pieces of public art. OV project updates

Here's the latest scoop on a few of Oro Valley's most anticipated projects. Please note that these updates were accurate as of publication date; however, due to the nature of construction projects and unforeseen weather events, projects are subject to change. Got questions? Community & Recreation Center Entryway and Elevator upgrades

Major accessibility enhancements, including a new elevator and modified entryway, are nearing completion. As of publication date, the elevator installation was set for January 2025, followed by a final inspection and approval process. Project wrap-up is anticipated by March 2025.

Leman School Crossing Zone

A new school crossing zone on Sunkist Road enhances safety for Leman Academy students. The Town partnered with Leman to construct ADA-compliant sidewalks and ramps, with work completed over winter break. The painted crosswalk is now in place and school zone signs will be installed.

Naranja Park improvements

Contractors are addressing drainage issues observed during last summer's storms to ensure better conditions for each of the park's multi-use fields. Additional efforts to improve water conservation at the Naranja Park splash pad are currently underway. This popular amenity will reopen for the season on April 1, 2025. Many thanks to our contractors, Haydon Building Corp and Cimarron Circle Construction, for their ongoing dedication to this project.
