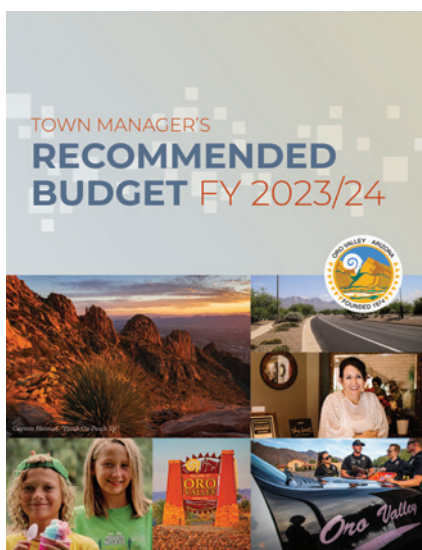

## Town Manager's Recommended Budget for FY 23/24



The Town Manager's Recommended Budget for Fiscal Year 23/24 has been published and is under review by Mayor and Council. In brief, the Town's balanced budget for Fiscal Year 23/24 totals \$147.9 million, representing an increase of only \$184,934, or one-tenth of one percent more than the adopted FY 22/23 budget of \$147.7 million. The General Fund budget totals \$56 million, a 5.5 percent increase from the FY 22/23 budget of \$53.1 million.

Residents are invited (and encouraged) to participate in the budget process by reviewing the document and sharing their thoughts at one of the two public hearings, to be held during the regularly scheduled Council meetings on June 7 and 21. And even if you're not a numbers person, be sure to read the Town Manager's message at the beginning of the document to get an overview of the funding priorities for FY 23/24. ## Golf course irrigation replacement has begun



Replacement of the irrigation system at the Cañada Golf Course is now under way! This project, which is part of the larger Parks Bond Projects initiative, will improve water use and efficiency by replacing an aging irrigation system. The golf course closed for play the week of April 24 so that crews could get to work. Additionally, the existing golf cart paths will be repaired, but that work won't begin until early August. In total, the project is expected to last about six months, which means golfers can tee up on the Cañada Course again by the middle of October! You may remember similar construction on the Conquistador Golf Course last year (which will remain open for play all year), and this project will bring the same quality of improvements to the Cañada Course. ## NARANJA PARK EXPANSION PROJECT



It's time to plant grass on fields five and six! But did you know it's not as simple as planting sprigs? The native soil in our region isn't permeable enough to effectively absorb and drain water, so it becomes overly wet and unstable. That's no good for growing grass. So there's a lot of prep work before the sprigs go in. First, drainage channels in a herringbone pattern are cut into the soil, and those channels are then filled with pea gravel wrapped in geotextile fabric. Then about eight inches of sand is placed on top. Since sand is permeable, it allows the irrigation water to travel down through the sand, nourishing the grass, and then draining away in the herringbone trenches. Now that the prep work is complete, the Bermudagrass sprigs are being planted and they'll start to grow in over the next several months.
