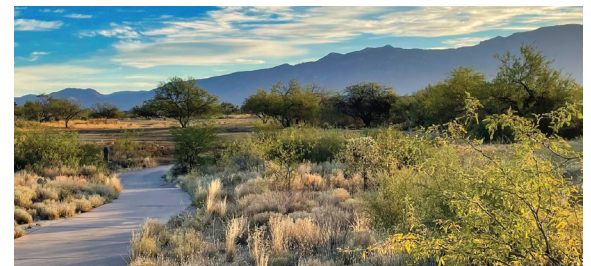
Karl Shaddock promoted to Assistant Town Manager

Emergencies can happen at any time. This is a great reminder for all of us to take a few simple steps now that can make a big difference later.

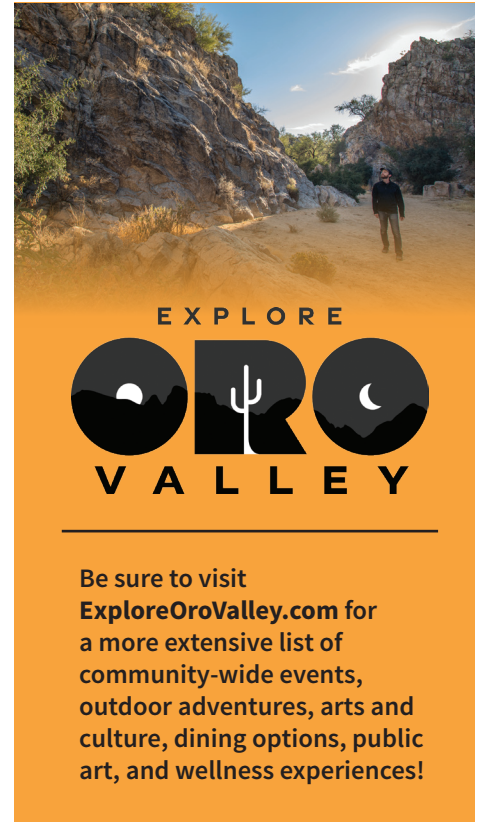
- To sign up for CodeRed emergency alerts, go to <http://go.ovaz.gov/codered>
