This implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) provides a more accurate tally of crimes because of its ability to "provide circumstances and context for crimes...". Because NIBRS data is not available for the year 2020, these charts will be comparing our traditional way of tracking crime in 2020 to NIBRS for 2021 and beyond.
