


## OV cuts the ribbon on expanded library parking lot



On September 29, the Town of Oro Valley, in partnership with Pima County and the Friends of the Oro Valley Public Library, cut the ribbon on a \$202,000 parking lot expansion project. \$150,000 of the total project cost was generously donated by the Friends of the Oro Valley Public Library. The remaining \$52,000 was funded by Library Impact Fees.

As the second largest facility in the entire county library system with the fourth-highest circulation, the Oro Valley Public Library had outgrown its parking facilities. The expansion project added 30 new parking spaces, improved landscaping and increased parking lot safety by including additional lighting and line-of-sight to the building.

The Gaslight Music Hall wants to be "Oro Valley's home for fun," said Robert Shaw, producer and artistic director of this Gaslight Theater offspring.

In turn, the Gaslight Music Hall has found a home in Oro Valley.

It all makes for a fun, entertaining, local night out for couples, friends and families.

"We're scratching an itch that needed scratching," Shaw said. "It's very affirming."
