1.0 PURPOSE

In order to reduce the potential for health hazards, identification for grease and gray water drainage pipes is required.

2012 International Plumbing Code (IPC), Section 1003 and 1301.5

5.0 POLICY

A means of identification or method for marking all grease and/or gray water drainage pipes, shall be included with the construction documents submitted for a permit and installed in the field.

Examples of such identification are:

1. The pipe may be identified with a **continuously stenciled identification** as a grease or gray water drain on the pipe. Stenciling shall not deteriorate under the conditions of use or affect the pipe material.
2. A **continuous tape** identifying the use of the pipe may be placed directly above the pipe.

Other methods proposed shall provide a clear identification and intended use of the pipe. All other methods shall be approved by the *building official* prior to installation and use.
